Instructions and Sample: Copyright Page  
for Dissertations and Theses

If you decide to include a copyright notice in your thesis, it should be placed on a separate copyright page. According to the seminary's [Format Guidelines](#), **the copyright page should follow the title page of your thesis.** In other words, Turabian's instructions for the *order* of these pages should not be followed, but for the *format* of the copyright page, Turabian should be followed (2007, 386). This notice legally establishes your copyright.

**Include the copyright notice near the bottom of the page, usually flush left.**

**The copyright page should follow the title page.**

**Leave a 1-1/2 inch left margin.**
